

In brief: Licenses

Every member of Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin is free to decide whether and if so which license is appropriate for his/her research data. However, patents and rights of third parties should not be infringed. For the licensing of research data, we recommend - in accordance with many German and international research funders and the Open Access Declaration of the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin - the use of open licenses (for example CC0, CC BY; GNU General Public License, MIT License, etc.).

Creative Commons:

The assignment of a Creative Commons license has - with the exception of CC0 (waiver of copyright/public domain) - no influence on your copyright. However, it offers the possibility to assign user rights for your research data in a simple and standardized way. You have the choice between different license levels. Keep in mind: A license free work is not the same as a free licensed work.









Please note that the use of Creative Commons licenses is not recommended for software (see software licenses) or data bases (an alternative could be ODbI). Please choose a specialized license for these types of research data.

Older research material might have already entered public domain (copyright expired). This depends on national legislation!
